


### New realities for youth, new avenues for youth work

Technological changes have impact on what it means to be young.

This impact is versatile, uneven and brings changes in many areas important for youth.

Youth work has a role to play in supporting, facilitating, creating conditions and opportunities for young people in these new realities.



# Youth work in digital era: smart youth work

- In Estonia *smart youth work* was developed as a term to encompass the areas for innovation in youth work taking into account to the digitalisation of the society. It was also to address the need for youth work to support the development of digital competencies of young people (and youth workers).
- Developing smart youth work builds on understanding and using data; finding digital solutions in planning, delivery and evaluation of youth work; (re)building relationships with young people and other sectors. The COVID-19 crises made the need clear.
- The topics that need special attention developing smart youth work are
  - inclusiveness and youth rights,
  - translating the value-set of youth work into practice in digital context,
  - quality of youth work.








